 - b. What does Paul value now?
 - c. How would you define "mature" in verse 15? Do we ever "arrive" this side of heaven?
- 3. Paul's new values flow from his identity in Christ (vs. 10-15.) Brainstorm what you think each might mean and how it could be lived out daily.
 - a. The power of His resurrection
 - b. Fellowship of His sufferings
 - c. Becoming like Him in His death
 - d. Attain the resurrection of the dead
- 4. Knowing Christ is a life-long process (Phil 3:12-13). How does one know Christ? What is one thing you could do to grow in knowing Christ more deeply?
- 5. What does it mean that Christ is your treasure? What clues would you look for?
- 6. How might a person go about determining their values, treasures, or passions? What specific things could help you?
