Sermon Questions - ReNew: God's Gift for You

- 1. Mixer: If you could have one superhero-type gift, what would it be and why?
- 2. Share your plan for 100 Days in the Bible with one another.
- 3. If your group is a newly formed group, read Romans 12:1-8 and discuss:
 - a. How do you think verse 1 relates to the use of spiritual gifts?
 - b. For what purposes are we given spiritual gifts?
 - c. Have you discovered your spiritual gifts yet? If not, go to spiritualgiftstest.com
- 4. If your group has already discovered and is using their spiritual gifts, read Matthew 25:14-30 and discuss:
 - a. What was the master's expectations for his servants?
 - b. What is your opinion of the master's treatment of the servant given one talent?
 - c. How would you define "talents" for a Christian today?
 - d. What is the main point of the parable?

Break into smaller groups of 2-3 and discuss the following:

- 5. Besides spiritual gifts, what other talents, abilities, and/or experiences have you been given? How can you use these to serve the local church, workplace, community or family?
- 6. Now answer #5 for each other. What talents, abilities and/or experiences do see in the group member? How could they use them in the local church, workplace, community or family?
- 7. In knowing ourselves with sober judgement (Rom. 12:3), which of these is the hardest for you? How can you grow in this area?
 - a. Accepting the personality and abilities God has given you
 - b. Accepting you will never be good at everything
 - c. Being free to truly be all God made you to be
 - d. Using what you have, not regretting what you don't have
- 8. Thank the Lord for the gifts, abilities, talents, and/or experiences you have been given. Ask the Lord how you can more fully use these to serve others.
