# The Gospel According to Luke - Wilderness Temptations

#### DISCUSSION

- 1. Read Luke 4:1-13.
  - A. How did Jesus respond to each of Satan's temptations?
  - B. How did Satan change his strategy on his third temptation?
  - C. What does this say about Satan's methods?
- 2. Pick a temptation that you experience repeatedly. How do you respond to it?
- 3. Luke 4:1-13 is the beginning of Jesus earthly ministry.
  - A. Why do you suppose that the Lord chose to test Him at this time?
  - B. Recall a time when you were tested. How did the Lord use that in your life for good?
- 4. Read Lk. 4:14-21 and refer to Isaiah 61.
  - A. When quoting Isaiah 61, why does Jesus stop at verse 2a?
  - B. When will Isaiah 61:2b-9 be fulfilled?
- 5. Read Lk. 4:22b-24. Think of someone you are so familiar with that you sometimes discount what they say. How might you assess whether you should take them more seriously?
- 6. Read Lk. 4:22-28. In verse 22a, "All spoke well of him..." yet in verse 28, "all the people were furious."
  - A. What happened in between these verses that moved the people to fury?
  - B. Why did Jesus choose to "poke the bear" by recounting accounts from Old Testament prophets that were unfavorable to the Jews?
- 7. Read Lk. 4:28-30. What does this say about the nature of Jesus and His mission?
- 8. When Jesus cast out the demon in Lk. 4:33-37, why did He tell the demon to be quiet even though he spoke the truth? Also see v. 41.

#### **APPLICATION**

- 9. Is there a way you can better respond to the temptation you thought of in discussion question 2 after hearing from the group?
- 10. Refer to discussion questions 6 and 7. Think of a situation where you need to "speak the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15). How can you do this?
